How to BE THE MEDIA at the Great Climate Swoop

We're pulling together all DIY media coming out of the Swoop into an exciting live user experience. Here's how you can be a part of it...

STEP ONE: Save Swoop into the contacts on your phone, and add the following details:

Phone: 07556 130 017

Email: swoop@climatecamp.org.uk

STEP TWO: Be The Media!

Send text updates about what's going on around you to **07556 130 017** always finish your message with the grid reference for the map square you're in (roughly) – for example: H12

If you have twitter set up on your phone you can tweet what's happening – just use the hashtag **#swoop** and add the grid reference from the map, e.g J11

Send photos or videos from your mobile phone via email or MMS to **swoop@climatecamp.org.uk** - You can add text to MMS messages and it will be added as a caption when the media appears online. Again - don't forget to add the grid reference from the map!

If you are arrested, you are entitled to:

- * **Be told** what you have been arrested for.
- * **Not to give** your name, address or DOB, but this will delay your release so you probably will want to give your name and address (not your DOB). Your photo, prints and DNA can be taken without your consent.
- * **Have one phone call** made on your behalf informing someone of your arrest. We recommend that you ask the custody sergeant to contact Climate Camp Arrestee Support. Tell the police you authorise them to talk to Arrestee Support about you and your welfare, so we can monitor your welfare and hopefully arrange someone to meet you on leaving.

REMAIN SILENT We strongly recommend you answer 'no comment' to all questions and during interviews, for your own benefit and that of others. From the moment you are stopped, everything you say is evidence - there is no such thing as a 'friendly chat'. The police are trained to get information out of you, so stay strong. Do not sign any statements.
